Mom, Dad, I Have Something to Tell You

Film Screening and Q&A with Israeli Actor and Gay Rights Activist Assi Azar

Assi Azar is a popular Israeli television personality and the host of the Israeli version of *Big Brother*, one of the country's most popular TV shows. Azar's documentary film "Mom, Dad, I Have Something to Tell You" deals with his experience of coming out as gay to his parents, as well as the coming-out stories of other gay Israelis and the reactions of their families. The film deals with the coming-out experience from two perspectives: that of gay and lesbian young people speaking openly with family members about their sexuality for the first time, and that of family members who have just learned that a loved one is gay. In addition to his work with *Big Brother*, Assi Azar has hosted a number of other programs, including the youth talk show Exit, Good Evening with Guy Pines, and The Champion: Locker Room, as well as the satirical programs Catch 24 (on Music 24) and Talk to My Agent (on the Israeli comedy channel Bip). Azar came out publicly in 2005 and often volunteers for LGBT youth groups in his spare time. In 2009, Assi Azar was named in Out magazine's list of the world's 100 most influential gay celebrities.
