Nili Cohen is a professor of law at Tel Aviv University, the incumbent of the Benno Gitter Chair for Comparative Contract Law, and a member of the Israeli Academy of Science and Humanities and the American Law Institute. Her teaching and research interests concern contracts, torts, restitution, comparative law and law and literature. She has been awarded the Minkoff Prize for Excellence in Law and the Zeltner Prize for Law and is the two-time recipient of both the Sussman Prize for Law and the Rector's Prize for Excellence in Teaching. Professor Cohen has published widely and is co-editor of Academic Freedom and The Three Religions and author of Interference with Contractual Relations and Inducing Breach of Contract. She has published more than 50 articles in Israeli and international law reviews, and her books and articles are frequently cited in Israeli court cases.
